WHAT IS TITLE IX?

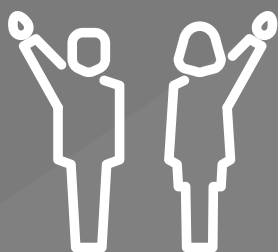
Title IX of the federal Education Amendments law of 1972 guarantees gender equity in all aspects of education when the educational activity or program receives federal financial assistance.



WHAT ARE SEXUAL HARRASSMENT & SEXUAL MISCONDUCT?

Sexual harassment is defined as unwelcomed conduct of a sexual nature.

Sexual misconduct includes sexual assault, dating violence, domestic violence, and stalking.



YOUR RIGHTS UNDER TITLE IX

The University of Indianapolis takes all allegations seriously and is committed to taking immediate, effective, and appropriate measures to respond to acts of sexual harassment and/or sexual misconduct.

What does that mean for a UIndy student participating in an internship, practicum, or service learning opportunity?

The rights and protections of the University's Title IX policy apply to students when they are involved in on- or off- campus programs.

You have the right to notify law enforcement of incidents and to receive assistance from campus personnel in doing so.	You have the right to identify witnesses who can attest to alleged discriminatory behavior.
You have the right to have your allegations investigated and resolved internally by the University.	You will receive amnesty for minor infractions of the student code of conduct that are secondary to incidents of sexual misconduct.
You have the right to have reported incidents addressed according to the published University procedures.	You have the right to be protected from all types of retaliation.
You have the right to have a support person present throughout all resolution proceedings. The person can be an advisor, advocate, attorney, family member, friend, faculty member, etc.	You have the right to be notified of all on and off campus counseling and health services available.
