The Laurelwood Partnership is one of UIndy's longest-standing community partnerships and is often used as a model to encourage sustainability of partnerships

among institutions of higher education with their surrounding communities.

Each week, UIndy student volunteers plan, coordinate, and lead activities for the youth in the low-income housing neighborhood, just a mile north of campus.

The Community Programs Center (CPC) is currently seeking to fill a Service-Engagement Corps (S-E Corps) Education Award Only position at Wheeler Arts Community (WAC), beginning in the fall semester of 2010.

As a S-E Corps members, students are required to complete 300 hours of service during the academic year of 2010-11. Upon completion of the service hours, students will be eligible to receive a

\$1,132 AmeriCorps Education Award, which can be used to repay qualified students loans or to repay the cost of attending a qualified institution of higher education.

The 300 hours should be successfully completed between September 2010 and August 2011. The member would preferably work late afternoons and during evening events.

The S-E Corps member will provide support to the

WAC Outreach Coordinator to serve the UIndy campus and the southeast communities of Indianapolis.

The position offers students opportunities to work with their local community. It also provides "hands-on" training in the arts, arts related fields, and non-profit work and other professional development opportunities.

A qualified candidate will be motivated, detail-oriented and have the ability to multi-task in a fastpaced environ-

ment. Strong organizational, written and verbal skills are imperative. The candidate must be dependable, flexible and have a willingness to work on a variety of tasks with a positive attitude.
